Foreword

2019 was a crucial turning point for Good Neighbors where it prepared the conclusion of its Vision 2020 under the catchphrase of “Good Change for the World” and it launched the new Vision 2030 with the aim of “Empowering People, Transforming Communities.” Good Neighbors’ Vision 2030 redesigns its strategic directions in network, resource, partnership, strategic goals, and action plans with the aim of operationalizing the founding spirit of “Autonomy and Respect” in alignment with the global effort to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

In partnership with 3,567 staffs, 89,763 volunteers, and 465,9999 community partners across the world, Good Neighbors has pursued strategic targets in poverty eradication through sustainable economic development, child protection by improving public awareness and strengthening social mechanisms., education by improving access to good quality education and infrastructure, health through prevention of malnutrition and improving access to good quality health services, WASH by supporting clean and secure water resource installing toilets, and stronger community governance by empowering community networks such as Community Development Committees for active participation and ownership and sustainable development.

To improve the quality of life and promote child rights, Good neighbors will reach out 290,000 sponsored children in 60 field countries until 2030. 362 community development projects and 50 social enterprises will reduce inequality and foster resilience of 7.6 million community peoples with 138,000 volunteers. Good Neighbors believes its mission to make the world a place without hunger, where people live together in harmony can be truly realized by empowering people, and transforming communities.

Supporting children's dreams and future

Expanding educational opportunities and strengthening digital capacities through 'Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Education'

Performance of Bangladesh ICT Education Project



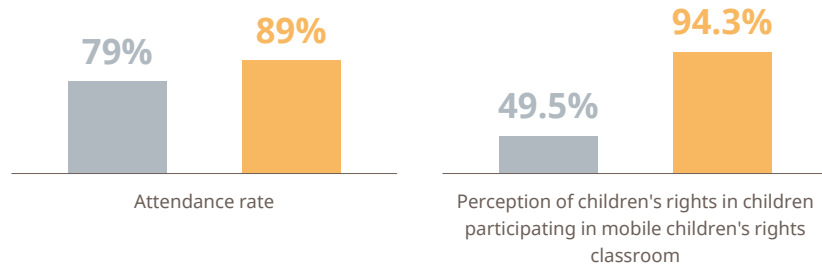

Bangladesh has serious educational inequality by region due to the disparity between urban and rural educational environments. In addition, the rights of children are in precarious situations 24% of children under the age of 14 are forced into early marriage and 13% are forced into child labor.

Good Neighbors Bangladesh has carried out education projects through ICT in 8 regions to ensure equal educational opportunities. We have expanded educational opportunities and strengthened digital capacities by providing educational digital devices and teaching IT technology in areas with poor educational environments. In addition, by developing applications for children's rights education and utilizing them to conduct the rights education, Good Neighbors Bangladesh has helped children develop the capacity and knowledge to protect their rights, while transforming the perception of local community.

We improved accessibility of education by supporting educational institutions so that all children may have education without discrimination. At the same time, we have built an educational environment in which children can dream freely, by improving the quality of education through teacher training and programs for foundational education as well as information technology, and self-improvement.

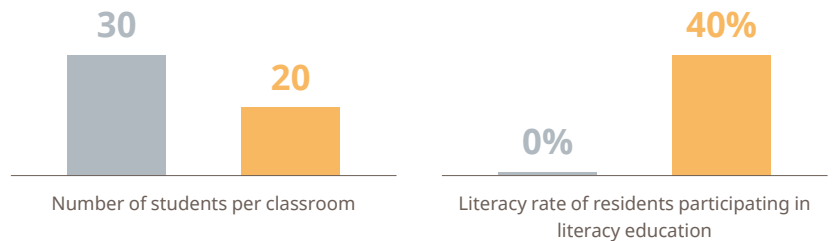

96% of residents of Kolojonome village in Hamdallaye region in Niger earn less than \$1 a day, and during harvest seasons the children were forced to work in the field instead of going to school. Residents of this village had low awareness of the importance of education and low level of literacy. Moreover, due to lack of educational facilities, such as school, several grades had to share one classroom. Good Neighbors Niger has built 6 classrooms to provide safe educational environment. In addition, we built a literacy education center and provided literacy education and child rights awareness improvement education to parents and residents to enhance the literacy of the community, and to create environment in which children’s education rights are well protected.

Health

Protecting the health of children and community members

'Maternal and Child Health Enhancement Project' to care for the health of babies and mothers

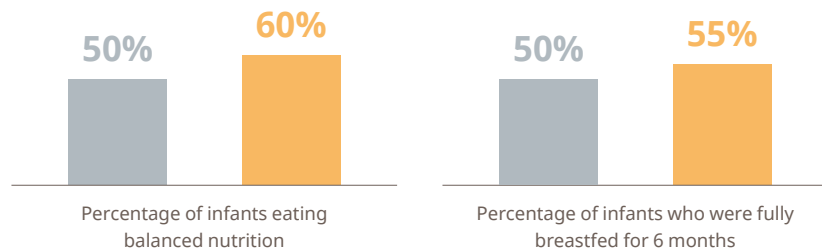

Health centers in Cheung Aek, Cambodia are highly crowded by residents especially pregnant mothers and babies. So not only basic health checkups but also maternal and child health services such as ultrasound test and ante/postnatal care are necessary.

In order to provide high quality maternal and child health services, Good Neighbors Cambodia provided medical devices such as ultrasound and medicines. And we provided specialized maternal and child health education to strengthen the capacity of medical staff. In addition, we provided education on the importance of breastfeeding and nutritional diet to 100 mothers, and also provided nourishing meals to 100 children for healthy and well balanced growth.



“When I saw my cousin give birth safely at the health center, I go to the health center and receive antenatal care. In particular, I feel grateful to be able to see the baby's growth through ultrasound test, and I will breastfeed as I have learned and take good care of my baby after giving birth.”

We have improved the quality of maternal and neonatal health services and have worked for disease prevention and nutrition for the healthy life of children and community members. Moreover we strengthened the capacity of health care workers. In addition, we have strengthened local health care system with various health care services such as supporting community health workers.

There are no public health centers for dentistry in San Miguel village of Las Mercedes, Paraguay. People can visit private dental clinics, but they are not affordable for many residents. Dental health awareness is low in this village, thus their oral health conditions are poor.

Good Neighbors Paraguay opened a dental clinic in a public health center for the dental care of the residents and children. At this clinic, children and locals can receive regular dental exams, cavity treatments, teeth cleaning. Moreover, we have taught how to properly brush teeth to keep their mouth in good condition.

“Dental conditions of local community members were poor. Even locals who had visited public dental center far away were not able to get the treatment because they are crowded. I feel great that after we opened this clinic, people’s lives are improved with dental visits.”

Water and Sanitation

Supporting Clean Water and Healthy Environment

‘Water and sanitation improvement project’ to protect hygiene in daily life with toilet support

Performance of Afghanistan Kabul Water and Sanitation Project

Kabul, Afghanistan lacks sanitary facilities such as toilets, and hygiene awareness is low. People are forced to get water from far distance because many water sources are contaminated with bacteria such as E. Coli. However, people still suffer from water-borne illness because the water is not managed well.

Good Neighbors Afghanistan provided toilets to 30 houses in poor sanitation to improve hygienic conditions. Moreover, we help residents understand how unhealthy habits affect health and lead them to have proper sanitary habit by educating them on how to wash hands and how to store water by using filters.



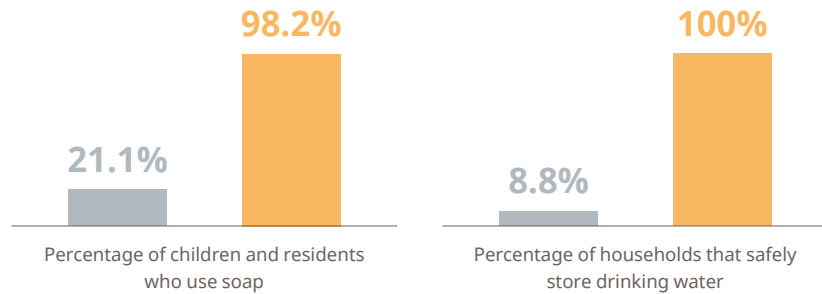

In order to make clean water accessible at any time, we installed drinking water facilities such as wells and water tanks, and operated a Water and Sanitation Committee to support a sustainable drinking water hygiene environment. In addition, to promote proper hygiene habits, awareness campaigns and education were conducted to help the local communities maintain a clean environment.

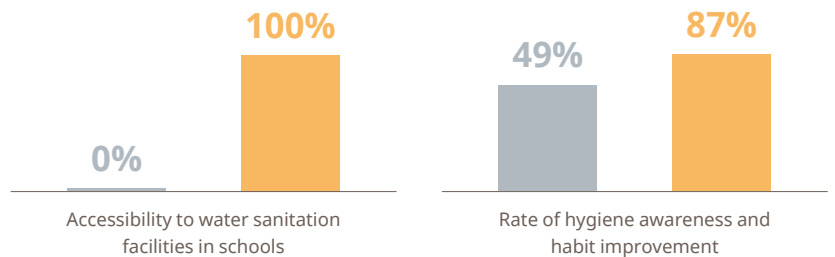

Due to the lack of clean water resources, children in Tanzania drink contaminated water and are vulnerable to various diseases - such as diarrhea and skin diseases. Moreover, some children often miss school because they had to walk 3-5 km a day to get clean water.

Good Neighbors Tanzania carried out "Good Water Project" at 6 schools with Lotte Mart Korea to help children drink clean water. We installed water tank and drinking facilities to improve water accessibility, and now children are able to study in school instead of spending time to get water. In addition, we installed hygiene facilities such as washbasins, and organized hygiene club which informs proper hygiene habits by various ways such as plays, songs and seminars.



“Previously, we drank a stream of water with a bottle taken from home or on the street. There are many sick students who drink dirty water because the bottles and water are not clean, and now students can drink clean water and have a healthy life.”

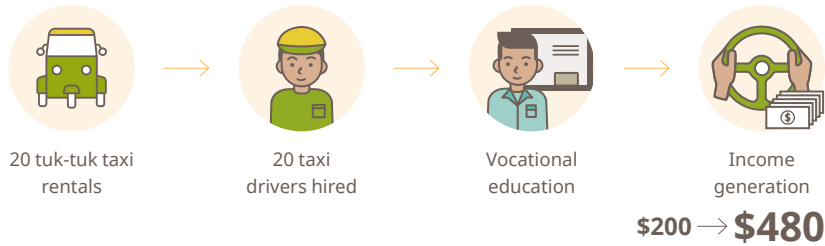


Income Generation

Building a foundation for self-reliance and Revitalizing a community

‘Tuk-tuk Taxi Union’ to increase the self-reliance with stable income

Tuk-tuk (taxi) is the primary transportation in Cambodia. Local residents want to earn income by driving Tuk-tuk, but many people cannot afford this vehicle due to its high price, which is over \$3000. The interests rate is around 21%, so even if residents are able to take out a loan, they pay most of their incomes to the bank. Good Neighbors Cambodia launched the income generation project that rents taxis to union members at a much lower rate than commercially available, in order to create jobs and increase self-reliance through tuk-tuk taxis. This allowed union members to begin their economic activities without having the burden of the initial costs. In addition, they receive vocational education, which allows them to operate a taxi safely, generate income, and realize the dream of independence by paying interest and principal.



“I used to earn \$5 a day, but now I earn \$15 driving a taxi. Now I can buy what I need, such as clothes and food, and am able to take good care of my family. Moreover, I am satisfied that I can support my daughter’s dream of becoming a doctor.”

Through cooperatives composed of community members, we created stable income, laid foundation for self-reliance, and operated social enterprises to provide jobs and social services. In addition, we trained sustainable farming methods to strengthen the capacity for self-reliance by fostering local communities to solve their own food problems.

‘Income Generation Project’ to promote community with of cooperative products

Good Neighbors is carrying out income generation projects in cooperation with the cooperative product brand ‘MERRYCOOP’ to increase the income of products produced by overseas cooperatives of member countries such as Mongolia, Guatemala and Tajikistan.

In Mongolia, the income of cooperative members increased by 4.9 times by training the Takhilt cooperative to produce cashmere products and increasing the competitiveness of products by developing new designs with Korean designers.

In the Kyrgyz Republic, a Korean dealership was linked to the Buguet cooperative, which had excellent felting skills but lacked a dealership. Through this, women cooperative members gained stable income, cared for their children's education and household, and gained confidence.

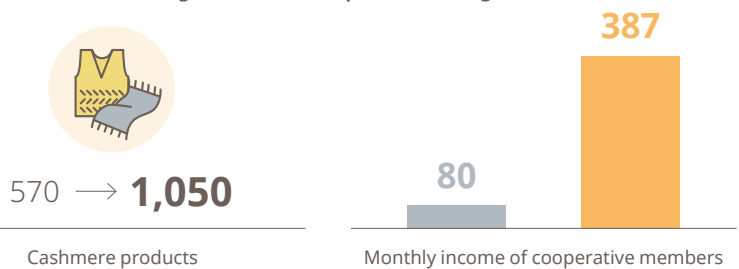

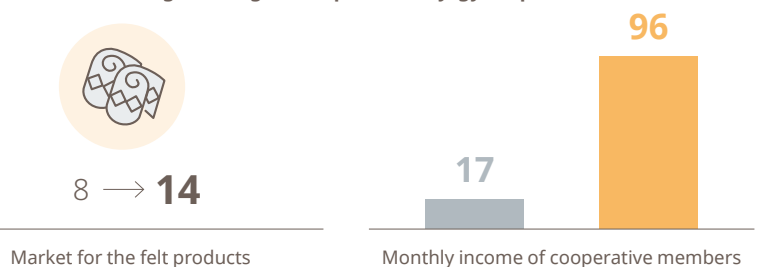
*Monthly income of cooperative members before and after cooperation with MERRYCOOP

Advocacy

Building a world where the rights of our children are protected

In order to protect children's rights safely, various advocacy activities such as organizing an advocacy group and conducting a campaign to improve rights awareness are implemented, while we hold discussions and policy forums with the government to establish child protection policies and systems, leading to changes in the community regarding child rights.

In Paraguay, child abuse are considered to be domestic discipline issues so teachers or other neighbors do not intervene when parents use corporal punishments for their children. Both children and adult do not fully understand child rights, and most children do not know how to respond when violation occurs.

Good Neighbors Paraguay supports child right promotion project with KOICA (Korea International Cooperation Agency) to help children understand their rights and protect themselves. Also, we organized media clubs by region to provide opportunities for children to be educated on various rights through various activities. In addition, to raise child right awareness, we hold workshops for government officials and campaigns for citizens to help all society members recognize the importance of protecting child rights.

“After joining the clubs, kids express their opinions in clear and diverse ways. Now I recommend club activities to people around me because I hope more children can get this opportunity for education.”

Humanitarian Assistance

Act quickly where people need help

We helped the recovery of the daily lives by providing emergency relief and reconstruction and recovery activities to neighbors who lost their place of life in a moment due to floods, earthquakes, etc. in 13 countries. Besides through the disaster risk reduction project, we developed a humanitarian support project that strengthens the ability to prepare for disasters and supports the safety and livelihood of refugees.

International Cooperation Project

Good Neighbors is making great changes in various parts of the world by professionally conducting projects with various domestic and international partners, such as individuals, enterprises, governments, and international organizations, who are committed to creating a world without hunger and a world to live together.

Official Development Assistance (ODA) Project

24 projects

Good Neighbors is carrying out the Official Development Assistance (ODA) projects in cooperation with the South Korean government and local organizations and other public organizations. In 2019, we conducted 24 projects in 18 countries to help solve economic, social, and environmental issues, and supported sustainable development by providing employment and business opportunities through the Inclusive Business Solution (IBS).

'Edutainment education project' to create a sustainable education environment

Good Neighbors Tanzania is conducting an IBS project to strengthen the capacity of the Zanzibar Quarara Media Education Center with the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA), SBS, and Daekyo Corporation to create a sustainable education environment through media education contents.

The Media Education Center learned broadcasting expertise and received council from the cooperative partners, and produced its own TV educational program "HappyTalk", including fun elements, and broadcasted it throughout Tanzania. Children can learn English naturally, empathize with their peers' thoughts, and develop creativity and challenging spirit with 'HappyTalk'. The Media Education Center continues to produce media education broadcast contents to inform the needs and values of edutainment in Tanzania and strives to build a sustainable education environment.

Special International Project

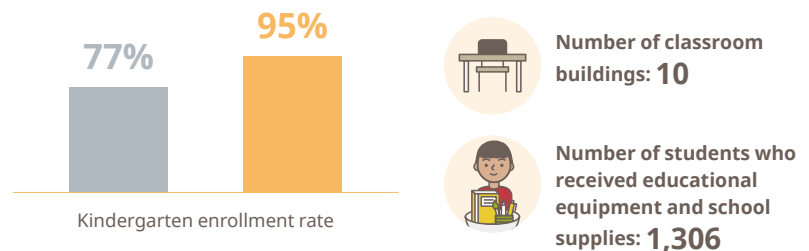
93 projects

Good Neighbors carried out a total of 93 overseas projects in various fields such as education, public health, and water and sanitation, along with individuals, groups, and enterprises in 2019. We planned and carried out the projects that connects the needs of the field with the intentions of sponsors and sponsored enterprises (groups) to promote independence and development of the community.

'Kindergarten and elementary school classroom construction' providing a safe educational environment

'Kiri, Rwanda has had only 2 elementary schools, which were built in 1971. Those two schools are not safe because facilities are too old and students need to share the classroom due to lack of educational facilities. Moreover, there were no kindergartens, so children had difficulties adjusting to school environment.

Good Neighbors Rwanda has built 10 classrooms and lunch place to help Rwandan children study in a safe environment with Spousal Association of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. In addition, we provide educational equipment, such as desks and chairs to create educational environment and improve quality of education.



“Thanks to the variety of school supplies such as desks and chairs to sit on, even the students who did not want to come to school before come with bright faces, and participate actively in class. Particularly, thanks to the kindergarten, children are well adapted to school and the school attendance rate has also increased.”

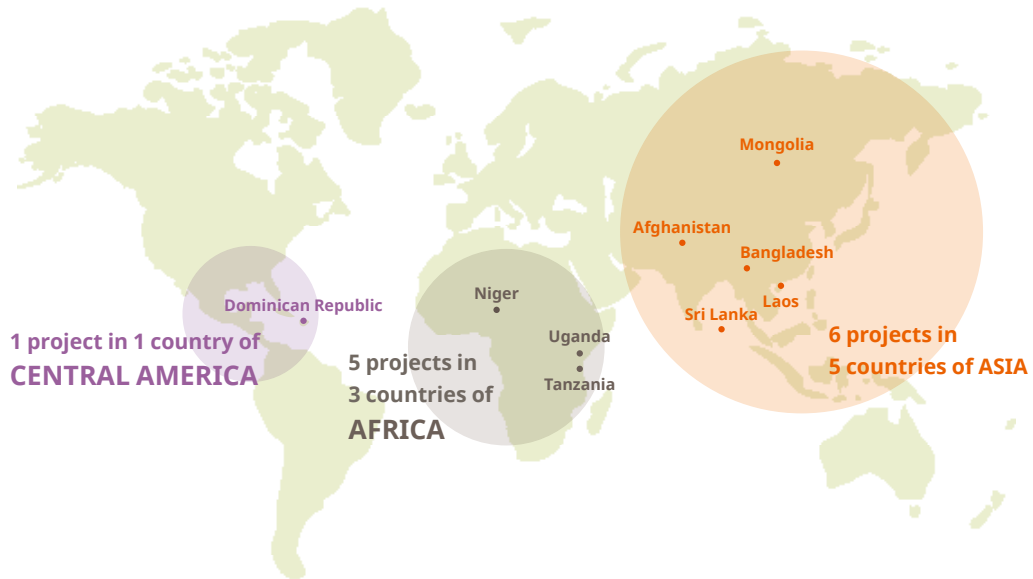

Cooperation with International Organizations

12 projects

Good Neighbors is conducting cooperative projects based on networks with various international organizations such as WFP, WHO, and UNHCR. In 2019, we have taken the lead in solving the problems facing the international community by conducting 12 projects in 9 countries and participating in international congresses and conferences.

A Study on the Achievement of WFP - Good Neighbors Cooperative Projects, Registered in International Journal



Good Neighbors evaluates and researches the performance of projects in other countries and specializes in the projects to fulfill its responsibilities as an international relief and development organization. In 2019, a research paper on the achievement of the Saemaul Zero Hunger Community (SZHC) project in cooperation with the United Nations World Food Program (WFP) was listed in the 'World Development', the world's most prestigious academic journal (Social Sciences Citation Index, SSCI) in the field of international development. The paper, which was jointly researched with the Social Science Korea (SSK) Development Partnership Research Group at Kyunghee University's International Development Cooperation Research Center, was listed

as the first international development research in the Korean private sector, and was recognized for its professionalism by the international community. In addition, joint research papers with external research institutes were listed in the 'International Development Cooperation Review' and 'Korean Journal of International Relations' to prove the effectiveness of Good Neighbors' project in various fields and cooperation with international organizations.

Support for DPRK

Good Neighbors has provided humanitarian aid to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (hereafter "North Korea") since 1995 to help children and residents in North Korea eat nutritious meals and grow up healthy and become self-reliant.

'Nutrition and Health Support Project' to support healthy growth of North Korean children

We supported North Korean children and residents in poor condition, to make them grow up in better conditions with hope, and eventually be able to stand on their feet. In 2019 we delivered milk powder and wheat flour 6 times through Good Neighbor USA, to prevent malnutrition and improve nutrition of infants and toddlers. Moreover, we delivered 58 types of medicines and took care of the children and residents' health.

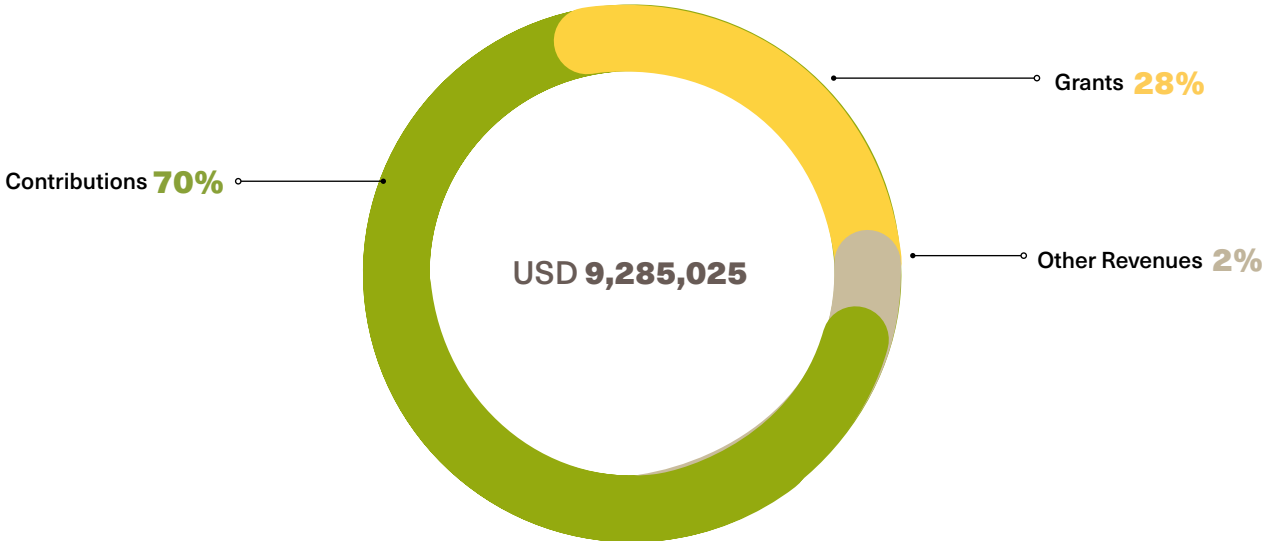

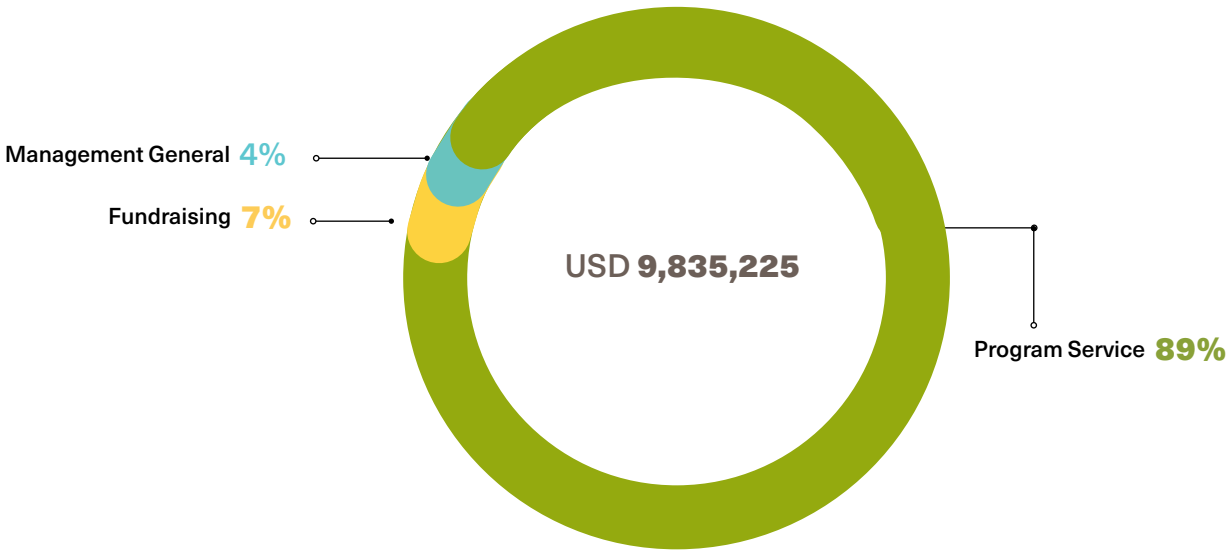
